LESSON AIMS: the students will:

- STATE the reason why weeping will be undetectable
- DEFEND identifications of figurative imagery in the text
- WRITE a prayer of thanks to God for the future He plans for him or her

INTRODUCTION: The prophets were God's spokespersons who declared boldly God's instructions to kings as well as everyday people. Their messages were sometimes of warning, and sometimes words of encouragement. The Book of Isaiah was written with two truths of fulfillment, namely the imminent return of the exiles from Babylon and the future messianic / church age, culminating in Christ's return. The Book of Isaiah ends with the beautiful picture of new heavens and a new earth.
