## **LESSON AIMS:** the students will:

- o Summarize Paul's concerns regarding the believers in Thessalonica
- Compare and contrast the Jews and Gentiles as Paul describes them in the lesson text
- Commit to offering Christian encouragement to a fellow believer in the week ahead

<u>INTRODUCTION</u>: Paul's first letter to Thessalonica was addressed to a church with a large Jewish population and an active synagogue. Here, Paul could speak and reach his fellow Jews as well as a large number of Gentiles, who were called "God-fearers". These God-fearers had accepted Scripture's religious and moral vision without converting to Judaism. Some people in every age dislike the Gospel and oppose it. The things they say haven't changed from the first century. Paul's love for the Thessalonians is evident - - a love so great that it moved him to work to support himself as he ministered there. That love moved Paul to pray for them constantly now that he has left.

KEY VERSE <sup>13</sup> For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.
