Summary: Isaiah predicts deliverance for God's people. This text is a part of a bigger portion of Scripture, Isaiah 24 and 25, which describes apocalyptic and eschatological literature. The prophet begins by describing the destruction God caused upon the enemies of His people. God made promises to His people. He has not forgotten those promises. God is faithful. Though His plan began long ago, it will be fulfilled in His time. God has given us free will. He allows us to decide to accept His free gift of eternal life, or listen to the lies of the enemy, and therefore, spend eternity separated from Him.

Questions:

1. *What effects could you anticipate if you reminded yourself daily of the wonderful promises God has fulfilled?*
2. *In what ways does the church demonstrate God's concern for the poor?*
3. *When considering death, do you tend to dwell on the certainty of God's work or the uncertainty of exactly what life after death will be like?*
